Meet Your Speaker

LT. COL. DAVE GROSSMAN, U.S. ARMY (RET.)

In their description of Lt. Col. Dave Grossman, Slate Magazine said, "Grossman cuts such a heroic, omnicompetent figure, he could have stepped out of a video game." He has five patents to his name, has



published four novels, two childrens' books, and six non-fiction books to include his perennial bestseller On Killing (with over half a million copies sold), and a New York Times best-selling book co-authored with Glenn Beck.

He is a US Army Ranger, a paratrooper, and a former West Point Psychology Professor. He has a Black Belt in Hojutsu, the martial art of the firearm, and has been inducted into the USA Martial Arts Hall of Fame.

Col. Grossman's research was cited by the President of the United States in a national address, and he has testified before the U.S. Senate, the U.S. Congress, and numerous state legislatures. He has served as an expert witness and consultant in state and Federal courts. He helped train mental health professionals after the Jonesboro school massacre, and he was also involved in counseling and court cases in the aftermath of the Paducah, Springfield, Littleton and Nickel Mines Amish school massacres.

Col. Grossman has been called upon to write the entry on "Aggression and Violence" in the Oxford Companion to American Military History, three entries in the Academic Press Encyclopedia of Violence, Peace and Conflict and has presented papers before the national conventions of the American Medical Association, the American Psychiatric Association, the American Psychological Association, and the American Academy of Pediatrics.

Since his retirement from the US Army in 1998, he has been on the road almost 300 days a year, for over 19 years, as one of our nation's leading trainers for military, law enforcement, mental health providers, and school safety organizations.

Today Col. Grossman is the director of the Killology Research Group (www.killology. com). In the wake of the 9/11 terrorist attacks he is has written and spoken extensively on the terrorist threat, with articles published in the Harvard Journal of Law and Civil Policy and many leading law enforcement journals, and he has been inducted as a "Life Diplomate" by the American Board for Certification in Homeland Security, and a "Life Member" of the American College of Forensic Examiners Institute.

MIKE HINSKE

Mike has been the School Safety Coordinator at Big Foot Union High School (BFHS) since 1996. He has created every policy and procedure for BFHS since that time as well as remodeled various areas of the building to make it safer. He is a student of school safety and shares his knowledge with anyone who wants in the name of safe schools for kids.

He is a leader in our community, county and the state.

He has changed our entry way twice based on knowledge provided pre and post Columbine (and other unfortunate tragedies). He has written policies and procedures, and personally trains our staff. Mike works closely with Walworth County and our local Walworth police department to ensure changes and techniques in school safety are the most current in the field.

BFHS was one of the first buildings in the area to have a secure entrance to their school. Our program and building have been a model for others to follow. As a facilitator and trainer, he continues to grow professionally and pass that knowledge on to others. He is currently on a drug task force in Walworth County and bringing that program to BFHS as a pilot. Mike's goals of safety for kids and schools has no boundaries. He understands that students who are socially and emotionally well creates safe schools. He genuinely wants to have the best culture possible which includes safe buildings.

Mike is an emergency management trainer and has attended the emergency management institute in Washington, DC. He also has been trained to be a facilitator through multihazard emergency planning for schools. His coursework includes Emergency Government Management, Incident Command, Emergency Response to Terrorism, Leadership and Influence in Emergency Management, Emergency Operations in Community Preparedness and Procedures, Response and Recovery and National Incident Management System. He also regularly attends all WSSCA training and workshops.

Mike is an emergency management trainer and facilitator and presents emergency management training as part of our module training to become a certified school safety coordinator.

Mike has been in education for 38 years and will be retiring as Principal of BFHS at the end of this year. He is excited to move to the next stage of life and plans to continue to train others around the state of Wisconsin in school safety.


